

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS

MATE DORMITORIES

The 1993 law number XCIII about work safety, the executive and additional regulations, furthermore the Work Safety Regulations of the University contain the specifications about not endangering the health of workers and students, and rules to follow in order to minimize risks. All those working, living and temporarily working in the buildings must know and comply with these rules and specifications.

The most important rules are the following:

1. It is the duty of students to protect their own and their peers' physical safety and health, and to gain knowledge conducive to health and safety.
2. If you detect any condition, malfunction or activity that endangers others, or you witness any accident or sickness, you must immediately notify the dormitory student coordinators or the responsible person on duty.
3. Regulations regarding students' health and physical safety, potential sources of danger, and expected conduct must be available to all.
4. All rooms, structures and tools must only be used properly, according to their purpose.
5. You must show behavior that is in accordance with the prohibitive and warning signs posted.
6. Only conduct that aligns with common interests is allowed in the dormitory.
7. All students are responsible for the safe and proper use of equipment, objects and devices of the dormitory.
8. It is strictly forbidden to change or alter the electrical network in any way.
9. It is not allowed to use heat-producing equipment (e.g. hotplates, heaters, etc.) in the rooms.
10. It is forbidden to store and to use other chemicals than those for personal use (make-up or cleaning products) in the rooms.
11. It is not allowed to leave out sharp and pointed objects used in the kitchen after use.
12. Stoves and ovens must be turned off after use, and must not be left unattended while in use. After using gas-based equipment, the gas must be turned off with the switch that belongs to the stove.
